Year 3 Curriculum Newsletter Summer Term 1 - 2015

Dear Parents / Carers

The curriculum for the first half of the Summer term is as follows:

English

The children will be reading and writing about Adventure Stories. These lessons will include the development of grammar, spelling and punctuation skills. The children will also be reading in school during the guided reading lessons.



Mathematics

The children will be learning and practicing fraction skills including fraction of a shape or an amount. We continue working on 2 and 3 digit numbers using addition and subtraction skills. We will also be revising and improving our time telling skills. Please encourage your children to learn the times tables to support the multiplication, division and fraction work. This will support their progression in rapid number recall and calculations.



International Primary Curriculum

The theme for this half term is 'Bright Sparks' (a science based unit). The children will be learning about electrical circuits and electricity safety. Other areas of the curriculum are integrated into this unit.



Religious Education



This term, the children will be learning about 'Christians and Muslims' and how their rules influence their actions. This includes finding out about their special places of worship.

Personal, Social and Health Education

This half term the theme is 'Relationships'.



Physical Education




In PE the children will be improving their skills in throwing, catching, agility and balance through a range of team games and activities. Yoga and tennis will also be taking place.
