



## Pupil Premium at Holdbrook Primary School

### What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium funding was introduced by the Government in 2011. It is intended to help schools provide targeted support for pupils who have received free school meals in the last 6 years, are the children of service personnel or are looked after children.

It has been identified that these children as a group do not perform as well as their peers from more advantaged backgrounds. Therefore the government grants schools additional funding to support the learning of these students. The school uses their discretion in the best way to support these pupils in their learning, looking at a range of influencing factors. To narrow the gaps in attainment between these groups of pupils we use strategies that are carefully matched to the individuals and that are informed by research. As for all children we are committed to having high expectations and delivering high quality teaching and learning for all children.

## What was the impact on the attainment of pupil premium children?

Based on Year 6 in 2015, Attainment of this group is below their peers in Writing and overall three subjects. While in reading and maths pupil premium children performed better than their peers. Compared to National other this group of children achieved better in reading and maths but well below in writing and overall.

Based on Year 6 in 2015 those children achieving L5 this group have not achieved as well as other school pupils or National other.

## How has Pupil Premium funding narrowed the gaps between these pupils and their peers?

The gap closed in Reading and Maths. The school needs to continue to work on writing.
