Spring Term - 2017

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you had a good break.



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Communication and Language:

This term there will be a focus on the children being able to maintain concentration when listening to a story, responding to what they hear, and extending their language so that they become more articulate in their conversation through topic work and through talking about their own experiences.

Physical Development:

The children will be further developing their writing skills so that they are forming letters correctly and with the appropriate pencil grip. Some activities will involve using scissors so that cutting skills improve. PE will be on a Wednesday afternoon.



Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

Pupils will be given opportunities to talk and share ideas in talking groups and during carpet sessions as this will help them to become more confident in social situations and within themselves. They will be given more responsibilities, e.g. carrying out small tasks, choosing and tidying away resources after learning time.

English:

In English we will be focusing on writing. We will be encouraging children to ascribe meaning to what they write. Children will be encouraged to write sentences and make attempts at sounding words out.



Mathematics:

We will be counting and recognising numbers to 10. We will be talking about what is 1 more and 1 less than a given number. We will be singing number rhymes, which will help the children to learn the sequence of numbers. Simple adding and taking away for example 3+1, 6-1.

Understanding of the World: The children will be talking about significant events in their own experiences during news time. They will be learning about the roles of people that help us during our topic.



Expressive arts and design:

The children will begin to build a selection of new songs in relation to the topic 'People who help us' such as '5 Little Firemen' and 'Miss Polly had a Dolly'.



Reading:

Reading books will be sent home weekly and changed as necessary. It would benefit your child greatly if you could please spend 5---10min each night reading to them and talking about their book – Any feedback can be written in your child's planner. Examples of how to help your child with reading: What do you think happens in the end of the story? Who is your favourite character? Did you enjoy the story? Why or why not did you like or not like the story. Your child will read with an adult in the class at least once a week. Please check your child's colour group to see which day this will be.

- Red group: Monday
- Blue group: Tuesday
- Green group: Wednesday
- Yellow group: Thursday
- Purple group: Friday
